## **2017 Educator Professional Development Conference**

The 2017 Educator Professional Development Conference (EPDC) hosted 270 educators in Cap-Haitian, Haiti from July 3-5, 2017. This conference provided training to primary and secondary level educators on a range of pedagogical, professional, and educational topics.


## **Methodology**

A summative evaluation survey was administered on the final day of the conference. The survey consisted of two sections, which were administered separately based on conference topics. The surveys were filled out anonymously. All data in this report are taken from the administered surveys, of which a copy is available in the Appendix.

## **Demographics**


### Gender

Survey participants were asked to indicate their gender. 69% of conference participants were female and 31% were male (N=263).




## Age

When asked to identify their age group, 49% stated that they were 35-44, 29% indicated that they were 45-54, while 14% indicated being 55-64. (N=263)




### **Education**

Participants were asked to identify their level of education. Of the sample population, 41% had completed university, 32% had completed secondary school, while 12% had completed primary school. (N=253)




## **School Type**

Conference attendees were asked to indicate the type of school they worked for. 75% of educators indicated working for a private school, while only 14% indicated working for a public school. (N=263)




## **Level Taught**

Conference attendees were asked to indicate what level they teach. 75% of educators indicated teaching at the primary level, while 13% indicated teaching at the secondary level. (N=263)



## **Prior Training**


Educators were asked to indicate whether or not they have received training prior to the conference. 92% of educators had received prior training, and 48% indicated that they have received training from P4H before. (N=263)


#### **Collaborate**

Participants were asked to indicate how strongly they agreed with the statement "I plan on collaborating with other teachers to help increase student engagement." 64% of attendees indicated 'strongly agree', 35% indicated 'agree,' and less than 1% indicated 'neutral' or below. (N=265)




## **Incorporate**

Attendees were asked to indicate how strongly they agreed with the statement "I plan on incorporating the teaching strategies I learned at this conference in my classroom." 69% of attendees stated 'strongly agree', 29% stated 'agree,' and less than 2% indicated 'neutral' or below. (N=265)




#### Share

Attendees were asked to indicate how strongly they agreed with the statement "I plan on sharing the information I received at this conference with other teachers at my school or in my community." 63% of educators stated 'strongly agree', 37% stated 'agree.' (N=268)




#### Return

Conference participants were asked to indicate how strongly they agreed with the statement "I plan on returning to this conference next year." 75% of attendees stated 'strongly agree', 20% indicated 'agree,' and roughly 5% indicated 'neutral' or below. (N=264)




#### **Effective**

Educators were asked to indicate how strongly they agreed with the statement "The training during the conference was effective." 96% of attendees stated 'strongly agree' or 'agree,' while roughly 4% indicated 'neutral' or below. (N=264)




## **Helpful Information**

Attendees were asked to indicate how strongly they agreed with the statement "I learned helpful information for my role as an educator during this conference." 68% of attendees stated 'strongly agree,' 28% indicated 'agree,' while roughly 4% indicated 'neutral' or below. (N=264)




#### **Presenters**


## **Adequate Time**






## **Impact: Section 1**

### **Summary**


Survey participants from section 1 of the conference were asked a series of questions in which they indicated how their position before and after the conference. The charts below display the average difference between before and after answers, the percentage of participants who indicated positive growth, and an adjusted figure that takes into account participants who had an initial position of 'Very High.' Participants were asked to select one of the following options: Very Low, Low, Medium, High, Very High. Each of the five choices were coded 1-5, respectively. A 1-unit difference in the below chart indicates an average growth of one choice-scale. The rest of this section will present in-depth statistics on each question asked. Chi-squared tests were conducted for each of the individual categories, all of which were significant at the 95% confidence level.






## **Strategies**

Attendees were asked to indicate their knowledge of strategies to reach students of any level in the classroom before and after the conference. The average change was 1.28 units, with 16 indicating no change, 81 indicating a change of 1 unit, 35 indicating a change of 2 units, and 9 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=143)




#### **Students with Disabilities**

Conference participants were asked to indicate their understanding of learning disabilities before and after the conference. The average change was 1.01 units, with 30 indicating a negative or no-change, 76 indicating a change of 1 unit, 25 indicating a change of 2 units, and 4 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=140)




#### **Collaborate**

Educators were asked to indicate their willingness to collaborate with other educators before and after the conference. The average change was 1.03 units, with 39 indicating a negative or no-change, 61 indicating a change of 1 unit, 24 indicating a change of 2 units, and 10 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=137)




#### **Lesson Plans**

Attendees were asked to indicate their ability to create effective lesson plans before and after the conference. The average change was 0.9 units, with 36 indicating a negative or no-change, 80 indicating a change of 1 unit, 15 indicating a change of 2 units, and 5 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=139)




## **Ability to Engage**

Conference participants were asked to indicate their "confidence in my ability to engage students at any level" before and after the conference. The average change was 1.06 units, with 28 indicating a negative or no-change, 79 indicating a change of 1 unit, 26 indicating a change of 2 units, and 7 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=142)




#### Role

Educators were asked to indicate their "understanding of how my role as an educator impacts Haiti" before and after the conference. The average change was 1.05 units, with 32 indicating a negative or no-change, 68 indicating a change of 1 unit, 28 indicating a change of 2 units, and 10 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=140)




#### Music

Attendees were asked to indicate their confidence in implementing music in the classroom before and after the conference. The average change was 1.34 units, with 25 indicating a negative or no-change, 59 indicating a change of 1 unit, 33 indicating a change of 2 units, and 20 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=140)



## **Importance**


Attendees were asked to indicate their understanding of the importance of collaborating with other educators before and after the conference. The average change was 1.02 units, with 32 indicating a negative or no-change, 74 indicating a change of 1 unit, 27 indicating a change of 2 units, and 5 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=140)




## **Impact: Section 2**

### **Summary**


Survey participants from section 2 of the conference were asked a series of questions in which they indicated how their position before and after the conference. The charts below display the average difference between before and after answers, the percentage of participants who indicated positive growth, and an adjusted figure that takes into account participants who had an initial position of 'Very High.' Participants were asked to select one of the following options: Very Low, Low, Medium, High, Very High. Each of the five choices were coded 1-5, respectively. A 1-unit difference in the below chart indicates an average growth of one choice-scale. The rest of this section will present in-depth statistics on each question asked. Chi-squared tests were conducted for each of the individual categories, all of which were significant at the 95% confidence level.






#### **Assets**

Educators were asked to indicate their understanding of the importance of collaborating with other educators before and after the conference. The average change was 1.22 units, with 15 indicating a negative or no-change, 70 indicating a change of 1 unit, 26 indicating a change of 2 units, and 8 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=122)




## **Use of Thinking Maps**


Attendees were asked to indicate their "knowledge of using thinking maps in my classroom" before and after the conference. The average change was 1.49 units, with 16 indicating a negative or no-change, 41 indicating a change of 1 unit, 45 indicating a change of 2 units, and 14 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=122)



#### **Adult Learners**


Conference participants were asked to indicate their understanding of needs of adult learners before and after the conference. The average change was 1.31 units, with 22 indicating a negative or no-change, 44 indicating a change of 1 unit, 37 indicating a change of 2 units, and 10 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=119)






#### **Collaborate**


Educators were asked to indicate their willingness to collaborate with other educators before and after the conference. The average change was 1.06 units, with 28 indicating a negative or no-change, 58 indicating a change of 1 unit, 26 indicating a change of 2 units, and 6 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=121)






### **Problem Solving**

Attendees were asked to indicate their "ability to problem-solve in my classroom" before and after the conference. The average change was 1.19 units, with 2 indicating a negative or no-change, 13 indicating a change of 1 unit, 31 indicating a change of 2 units, and 4 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=122)




#### Music

Conference participants were asked to indicate their understanding of needs of adult learners before and after the conference. The average change was 1.52 units, with 15 indicating a negative or no-change, 44 indicating a change of 1 unit, 40 indicating a change of 2 units, and 17 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=122)




#### Role

Educators were asked to indicate their "understanding of how my role as an educator impacts Haiti" before and after the conference. The average change was 1.30 units, with 16 indicating a negative or no-change, 57 indicating a change of 1 unit, 38 indicating a change of 2 units, and 7 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=119)




## **Helping Teachers**

Attendees were asked to indicate their confidence in helping other teachers with their teaching skills before and after the conference. The average change was 1.14 units, with 21 indicating a negative or no-change, 60 indicating a change of 1 unit, 29 indicating a change of 2 units, and 6 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=121)



## **Applying Thinking Maps**

Conference participants were asked to indicate their confidence in applying thinking maps to increase student engagement before and after the conference. The average change was 1.47 units, with 18 indicating a negative or no-change, 48 indicating a change of 1 unit, 31 indicating a change of 2 units, and 21 indicating a change of 3 or more. (N=120)
